## Effingham.

Effingham is a parish on the main road between Leatherhead and Guildford, and two miles from the Effingham Junction Station on the S.W. Section, Southern Railway. It is 3½ miles from Leatherhead, 4½ miles from Dorking and 21 miles from London. It forms part of the Reigate Parliamentary Division, Dorking Petty Sessional Division, Union and County Court District, Diocese of Guildford, Archdeaconry of Surrey, and Rural Deanery of Leatherhead. The Parish Church of St. Lawrence, whose register dates back to 1560, has 300 sittings, and is in the Gothic style of architecture. It was thoroughly restored in 1888 at a cost of £3,000. The living is a Vicarage of the net value of £135, and is in the gift of the present Vicar, the Rev. E. F. Bayley, M.A. There is also a Wesleyan Church and a Roman Catholic Church. The area of the parish is 3,183 acres, and the population at the 1921 census was 605.

## Fetcham.

Fetcham is a parish situated on the main road between Leatherhead and Guildford, and is one mile from the Leatherhead Station on the Southern Railway. It is six miles from Dorking and 19 from London. Fetcham forms part of the Epsom Parliamentary Division, Petty Sessional Division, Union, and County Court District, Diocese of Guildford, Archdeaconry of Surrey, and Rural Deanery of Leatherhead. The Parish Church of St. Mary is in the Early Norman style, and contains 280 sittings. The chancel was restored in 1872 and the north aisle rebuilt in 1877, and the building is now in a good state of preservation. The register dates from 1559. The living is a Rectory of the net value of £460, and is in the gift of the Executors of the late Sir Francis S. G. Moon, Bart. The area of the parish is 1,840 acres, rateable value (October, 1927), land, £966, buildings, £12,083, and the population at the 1921 census was 410.
